THE DIRECTORS' REPORT

YEAR ENDED 30TH SEPTEMBER 2005

The directors have pleasure in presenting their report and the independently examined financial statements of the company for the year ended 30th September 2005.

PRINCIPAL ACTIVITIES

The principal activity of the company during the year was to preserve, conserve, restore and improve the environment. To promote trade and industry, for the benefit of the general public. To advance education with the view to improving their conditions of life. To provide or assist in the provision of housing for persons within Kirkhill and Bunchrew in necessitous circumstances and/or housing adapted to meet special needs of persons suffering from mental or physical disability, illness or impairment or old age. To relieve poverty, particularly among the residents of the Kirkhill and Bunchrew. To promote, establish, operate and/or support other schemes and projects of a charitable nature.

In the year to September 2005 five working groups of the company were active.

Aird Community Links and Transport Group

The Aird Community Links project has now been open for 3 years. The work this year has involved monitoring and maintaining the Inchmore/Moniack roadside path.

Increasing use is made of the path particularly by walkers. The average number of journeys per week was 77 by foot and 30 by cycle for the period October to September 2005. Costs for maintenance and monitoring came to £90.

Negotiations between KBCT and the Highland Council TEC Services for a feasibility study for a roadside route between Beauly and Inverness are ongoing.

The Community Woodland Group

The group has been working with agreement of Forest Enterprise (FE) in Reelig Forest. About a dozen regular volunteers thinned trees and stacked them for firewood. Sales of firewood amounted to £618.

A very successful Woodland Fair was held in May in Upper Reelig Wood with around 200 people in attendance. The Partnership for Rural Inverness and Nairn contributed £650 towards total costs of £740.

Membership of The Community Woodland Association was purchased and members attended their conference.

The Environment Group

The group organised litter picks and continued to investigate the formation of a wildflower meadow in the field next to the new Wardlaw Graveyard. The group continues to support the Eco-schools project at Kirkhill Primary School.

The website <u>www.kirkhillandbunchrew.org.uk</u> continues to hold information on community events, clubs, businesses and local information. Website hosting cost $\pounds74$.

Kirkhill Community Park

The group continued to take forward a project to improve and refurbish the park in Kirkhill. Following negotiations with The Highland Council and the landowners, agreement to a 10 year lease was established. The legal process continues.

Equipment has been selected to be fully inclusive to ensure the park is well used and to create a sense of pride and real community spirit. This includes the creation of a natural play area and wild garden that includes willow sculptures and fruit trees.

Quotes for equipment and works were obtained and costs in the region £110,000 were estimated. Grant funding opportunities were identified and local fundraising raised £327.

Core Costs

Administration costs were kept very low. Insurance costs are shown as zero, however, the 2004-05 invoice was delayed (£307) and will be paid for in 2005-06. Insurance costs have been met from sales of firewood by the Community Woodland group. Membership of the Development Trusts Association Scotland and the Community Woodlands Association came to £90.

Fundraising

Fundraising for unrestricted activities raised £35 net. However, £156 was spent on expenses for the raffle of a hand-made quilt, generously made by members of the community. The raffle will be drawn in December 2005 and income shown in that year. Activities included two car boot sales. The 100 club had only 12 members and was closed in December 2004, some members choosing to retain their payment as a donation.

Donations

Donations in the furtherance of Trust activities amounted to £56.
